












What Creates Village Character?

- Two sets of considerations
 - How the lot is developed? Where the building and parking are located, etc.
 - We might think of these as the site factors
 - How the building is designed? Height, roof line, windows, etc.
 - We might think of these as the building factors

Site Factors – an Example



Site Factors - Plan View



Key Site Factors

- Building located close to the street
- Area between the front of the building and the street used for pedestrians and landscaping – not cars
- Parking and service areas at the side or rear of the building
- Provisions for pedestrians

Key Building Factors

- At least two stories or designed to look like more than one story
- Pitched roof
- Structural elements on the roof dormers, chimneys, towers, etc.
- Strong clear entrance to the building
- Windows with a vertical orientation
- A pattern of windows and solid wall on the front of the building
